ABOUT THIS WORKSHOP:

Jan-Hendrik Cropp from under_cover in Germany will deliver critical information that NH farmers can employ to better mitigate the effects of flooding, drought, and the increasing frequency and intensity of storms.

Topics to be covered include: no till/low-till, living and/or dead mulching, cover crops, rotational conservation, and more.
